Mr. BELL, from the Committee on Indian Affairs, to which the subject had been referred, made the following

REPORT:

The Committee on Indian Affairs, to which was referred the resolution of the House of the 15th January last, directing them to inquire whether any and what abuses or irregularities have taken place, or now exist in that branch of the public service which relates to Indian Affairs, respectfully report:

That they have had the same under consideration, and have made some progress therein, but have not completed the same. And they now submit to the House their proceedings with the papers and testimony relating thereto. They are of opinion that there are sufficient grounds for a further examination.
