Mr. HAWES, from the Committee on Indian Affairs, made the following

REPORT:

The Committee on Indian Affairs, to which was referred the petition of Anne Anderson, report:

That it appears, from the petition and proof in the case, that in the year 1788, William Anderson, the husband of the petitioner, lost property to the amount of \$325, by the destruction of the boat of Joseph Brown on the Holstein river, by the Cherokee Indians. As this case depends on the same principle with that of Joseph Brown, a majority of the committee concur in the views contained in the report made by the Committee on Indian Affairs, 17th Feb. 1832, and refer to that report in explanation of the grounds upon which the claims of the petitioner rest.

The committee, therefore, have reported a bill.
