REPORT:

The Committee of Claims, in the case of Joseph Brown, report:

That the House of Representatives, on the 19th of February, 1838, on

motion of Mr. Shields, passed a resolution as follows:

"Resolved, That the Committee on Indian Affairs be instructed to inquire into the expediency of paying Colonel Joseph Brown the balance claimed by him to be due for the property lost in the Seminole campaign by the following persons, to wit: Hugh McBride, John Tussell, Jacob Ellison, Hugh Long, Daniel Ridge, John Stephens, James Taylor, Isaac Patterson, and Samuel Walker, and transferred by them to the said Joseph Brown, and now on the files of the House."

The Committee on Indian Affairs were discharged from the further consideration of the resolution, and the same was referred to the Com-

mittee of Claims on the 13th of March, 1838.

The same case, with the same testimony, was presented to the House on the 20th of December, 1836, and, after an examination, the committee reported against the claim on the 22d of February, 1837.

This report, recorded in vol. 11, page 542, manuscript reports, is refer-

red to, and made a part of this report.

This committee concur in that report, and in the resolution then submitted.

FEBRUARY 22, 1837.

The Committee of Claims, instructed by a resolution of the House of Représentatives on the 20th of December, 1836, to inquire into the expediency of paying to Colonel Joseph Brown the balance claimed by him to be due for the property lost in the Seminole campaign by the following persons, to wit: Hugh McBride, John Tussell, Jacob Ellison, Hugh Long, Daniel Ridge, John Stephens, James Taylor, Isaac Patterson, and Samuel Walker, and transferred by them to the said Joseph Brown, and now on file in the Third Auditor's office, report:

That a letter was addressed by the committee to the Third Auditor, requesting him to transmit said claims to said committee, and also requesting such information as he could communicate on the subject of said claims. His answer, of the 26th of December, 1836, is received, and referred to; he states, the papers were all returned to Mr. Brown on the 3d of June, 1824, Thomas Allen, print.
