### THE SECRETARY OF WAR,

In compliance with a resolution of the Senate, in relation to the termination of the commission for the adjudication of claims under the Cherokee Treaty of December 29, 1835, and the expenses of the same.

#### WAR DEPARTMENT, February 8, 1839.

SIR: I respectfully transmit the accompanying report of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, in reply to the resolution of the 10th ultimo, calling for information whether the commission for the adjudication of claims under the Cherokee treaty of 1835 has been terminated, the expense of that commission, &c.

WAR DEPARTMENT,

Office Indian Affairs, February 6, 1839.

SIR: I have the honor to report on the resolution of the Senate of January 10th :

The commission created under the treaty with the Cherokees of December 29th, 1835, was instructed on the 17th ultimo, that it was the opinion of the department their services might be terminated without injury to any public interest, and that it was its wish they should close the business confided to them without delay, and transmit their final reports. This direction was not given at an earlier day, because many of their duties had not been fulfilled, and because there was nothing in the terms of the 17th article of the treaty, which provided for their appointment, which, in the judgment of the department, restricted its duration to the 23d of May last, the day named in the 16th article as the one before which the Indians must emigrate. They had, however, been previously instructed not to receive any new claims after that time.

The accompanying statement shows the expense of this commission, so far as it can be ascertained from the accounts rendered, to whom the several sums have been paid, and the amount paid to each individual.
