Mr. WILLIAMS, of New Hampshire, from the Committee of Claims, made the following

REPORT :

The Committee of Claims, to whom was referred the petition of Allen Gentry, claiming compensation for property alleged to have been destroyed by Tennessee volunteers while commanded by General Armstrong, on their march to the Creek and Seminole war, in the summer of 1836, report :

That said *petition* was referred to the Committee of Claims at the 2d session of the 25th Congress, and that Mr. Whittlesey, chairman of said committee, (as will be seen by reference to Reports of the House of Representatives of that session, No. 1036,) reported a resolution, which was adopted by the House, "that the petitioner is not entitled to relief." The committee, finding no additional testimony in support of the claim, and concurring in and adopting the report to which they refer, submit the same resolution :

Resolved, That the petitioner is not entitled to relief.
