Mr. SIDNEY LAWRENCE, from the Committee on Revolutionary Pensions, made the following

REPORT:

The Committee on Revolutionary Pensions, to whom was referred the petition of Lawrence Van Dyck, report:

The petitioner claims to be the son of a soldier of the revolutionary army, who was killed in a battle with the Indians in the county of Delaware, New York.

There is no law authorizing a pension in similar cases, nor is there any precedent of this character where special acts have been passed, granting a pension to the son.

The committee, therefore, ask to be discharged from the further consideration of the memorial.
