REPORT:

[To accompany bill S. No. 260.]

*The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the petition of Frederick Dixon, beg leave to report:*

That the petitioner sets forth in his petition that he has received several hurts and wounds while serving his country in the northwest, in the war of 1812, and in subsequent wars with the Indians; and although he does not furnish sufficient proof to warrant the proper department in placing him on the pension list, the committee are satisfied, from the personal knowledge which senators from Iowa and Wisconsin have of the petitioner, and of his services, sacrifices, and wounds, that he is a proper subject for the national bounty. They therefore report a bill for his relief.
