THE MISCELLANEOUS TALENTS OF EUGENE KUNTZ

Gene Kuntz has made substantial contributions as faculty member and Dean to the College of Law over the years since 1952 when he joined the College of Law. Among his contributions that might be lost from the record unless memorialized here, however, are his arrangement and programming of the various faculty pageants at Gridiron over the years; the dramatic productions of "The Lighthouse," "The Fire March," and "The Water Pageant"; and in recent years the various musical productions for Gridiron in which he has participated, at different times, for voice, zither, and/or bass violin and guitar. Gene Kuntz also leads a unique cheer at auspicious occasions that should be preserved for others to use at similar auspicious occasions.
