R E P O R T .

The Committee on Indian Affairs, to whom was referred the petition of Stephen Krebs, Mary McGehey, and Lucy Long, children of Stephen Krebs, a citizen of the Choctaw nation, report :

That the claims of the Choctaws under the treaty of Dancing Rabbit creek against the United States, have been assumed by the Choctaw Nation by the late treaty with them; and the Senate of the United States having, at its late special executive session, awarded the indemnity as provided for by the late treaty, the claim of the memorialists is no longer of any force against the United States. The committee therefore report, by resolution, that the claim be rejected.
