WAR DEPARTMENT, December 30, 1868.

The Secretary of War, in obedience to the Senate's resolution of December 14, 1868, has the honor to submit the accompanying statement, prepared by the Adjutant General of the army, as to the number of United States troops employed in connection with Indian hostilities in protecting the Missouri river traffic and the Union Pacific railroad, and otherwise policing that region of country; also a statement of the number of volunteer troops in service, and the authority for their employment.

Lieutenant General SHERMAN, *St. Louis, Missouri:*

You are authorized by the President, if you deem it necessary to a successful prosecution of the present campaign against the Indians, to accept the service of one regiment of volunteer cavalry from the State of Kansas, to be mustered into the service of the United States for six months, unless sooner discharged.

Please communicate with General Grant as to the remaining four companies of the 5th cavalry.

Under the above, the governor of Kansas was called upon for one regiment of mounted volunteers to serve for a period of six months, unless sooner discharged, against the hostile Indians on the plains.

This regiment, (designated the 19th Kansas cavalry,) according to rolls in this office, is now in service, with the following organization: 1 colonel, 1 lieutenant colonel, 3 majors, 1 surgeon, 2 assistant surgeons, 1 regimental adjutant, 1 regimental quartermaster, 1 regimental commissary of subsistence, 12 captains, 12 first lieutenants, and 11 second lieutenants. Total commissioned, 46; enlisted men, 1,167; aggregate, 1,213.

Muster-in rolls and enlistments are being rapidly received, indicating the completion of the regiment at an early day.
