SIR: I have the honor to inclose herewith, with the request that the same be laid before Congress for the favorable consideration and action of that body, an estimate for an appropriation to meet outstanding indebtedness on account of the Indian service in California, incurred in the years 1857, 1858, and 1859, amounting to \$3,733.79, said sum being the total amount of claims admitted by the accounting officers of the Treasury as due and unpaid on the settlement of the account of M.
