Mr. SMART, from the Committee on Invalid Pensions, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany bill H. R. 3729.]

In the matter of the bill (H. R. 3040) granting a pension to Mrs. Ann Eliza Brown.

Your committee would respectfully report that Mrs. Ann Eliza Brown is the widow of the late Col. Harry Brown, brevet major-general United States Army, who died 31st of March, 1874.

Colonel Brown graduated in 1818 at West Point, and served for many years with great gallantry, and finally died of Bright's disease of the kidneys, contracted during the Seminole war in Florida. In view of his long and gallant service, your committee believe it right and just to relieve the necessities of his widow, who is reported to be in want.

The committee accordingly report favorably, and recommend the passage of the accompanying bill.
