The Committee on Indian Affairs, to whom was referred House bill No. 819, for the relief of Joab Spencer and James R. Mead for supplies to the Kansas tribe of Indians, beg leave, after full consideration of the facts and testimony in the case, which are clearly set forth in report No. 376, Forty-fifth Congress, second session, of the Committee on Indian Affairs of the House, to which report special reference is made, and which is hereby adopted as the report of the Committee on Indian Affairs of the Senate, to report the bill back favorably, and recommend its passage.
