In response to Senate resolution of the 22d instant, a statement of the sums of money paid to the Ponca Indians since 1871, and under what treaty obligation.

SIR: I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of Senate resolution of the 22d instant, directing this department "to communicate to the Senate what sums of money have been paid each year since the fiscal year eighteen hundred and seventy-one, on account of the Ponca tribe of Indians, and under what law or treaty obligations the same have been paid," and in reply thereto I transmit herewith an itemized statement of amounts paid said Indians each year since fiscal year of 1871, &c., together with copy of letter from the Commissioner of Indian Affairs of the 27th instant, to whom the subject was referred for report.
