Mr. GROOME, from the Committee on Pensions, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany bill, S. 754.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (S. 754) to increase the pension of Mrs. Laura Hentig, have examined into the subject-matter, and report:

That Mrs. Laura Hentig is the widow of Edmund C. Hentig, late a captain in the Sixth Cavalry, United States Army, who was killed by Indians, in Arizona, August 30, 1881, while in the line of duty. Mrs. Hentig applied for a pension and it was promptly granted to her at the rate of twenty dollars a month, the full rate allowed to widows of officers of her husband's rank. The object of the bill referred to your committee is, as its title indicates, to increase her pension.

Your committee report the bill back with a recommendation that it do not pass.
