CERTAIN URGENT DEFICIENCIES IN APPROPRIATIONS
 FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1882.

FEBRUARY 10, 1882.—Committed to the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union and ordered to be printed.

Mr. HISCOCK, from the Committee on Appropriations, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany bill H. R. 4221.]

In presenting the urgent deficiency bill for the fiscal year 1882, the Committee on Appropriations submit the following in explanation thereof:

The bill is based upon representations from the various heads of the departments that the amounts recommended are urgently and immediately necessary to aid in completing the service of the government for the current year. The amounts recommended are for purposes as follows:

For the public printing	\$400,000 00
For the steamer Fessenden, additional appropriation to complete	30,000 00
For the transportation of coin and bullion	50,000 00
For the construction of vaults, and provision for safe keeping of coin, &c.	75,000 00
For fuel, lights, and water, Treasury Department buildings throughout the United States, 1882	75,000 00
For judgments Court of Claims	310,000 00
For Navy Department	100,000 00
For the Indian service, principally for Sioux of different tribes	419,000 00
For removing bath-rooms, House of Representatives...	3,000 00
For photolithographing, Patent Office	33,733 29
For the clerical force, Land Office	25,000 00
For the General Land Office, worn and defaced maps, to reproduce	15,000 00
For the clerical force, Pension Office	75,000 00
For Under Commissioner of Fish and Fisheries	77,000 00
For the Post-Office Department	100,000 00
For the House of Representatives, furniture	5,000 00
For the District of Columbia, out of United States Treasury	8,250 00
For the Executive Mansion, furniture, repairs, &c.	22,000 00
