REPORT:

[To accompany bill S. 512.]

The Committee on Military Affairs, to whom was referred the bill (S. 512) for the relief of citizens of Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and Montana, who served in connection with the United States troops in the war with the Nez Percé Indians, and for the relief of the heirs of such as were killed in such service, and for other purposes, have carefully examined the bill and the papers therewith submitted, and report—

That the information contained in the papers accompanying the bill is too indefinite to justify the committee in recommending the passage of the bill, and your committee therefore report adversely, and recommend its indefinite postponement.
