Mr. BROADHEAD, from the Committee on the Judiciary, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany bill H. R. 6404.]

The Committee on the Judiciary, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. [713) to authorize the service of civil and criminal process issued by Perritorial courts within military and Indian reservations, and the Yellowstone, have had the same under consideration, and report the Ecompanying bill as a substitute therefor, and recommend its passage.

Questions have arisen in some cases as to whether under the existing laws establishing Territorial courts, and defining their powers and duties, the power is given to cause the process of said courts to be served and executed within certain Indian and military reservations, and this bill, it is thought, will set at rest any question.
