Mr. BLISS, from the Committee on Pensions, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany bill H. R. 10629.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 10629) granting a pension to Washington Ryan, have considered the same, and report as follows:

The claimant served twenty-two days, including travel, as third corporal, Capt. Richard Netherland's company, Third Regiment, Second Brigade, Tennessee Volunteer Militia—Indian war. He is now seventy-one years of age, old, infirm, and unable to earn a living by manual labor. Hon. J. D. C. Atkins and Hon. James D. Porter, of Tennessee, certify that the claimant is worthy and credible.

He is entitled to a service pension, in the opinion of your committee, and the passage of the bill is therefore recommended.
