Mr. DAVIDSON, of Florida, from the Committee on the Library, sub-

REPORT:

[To accompany bill S. 2787.]

The House Committee on the Library, having considered the bill (S. 2787) to provide for the erection of an equestrian statue of ex-President Zachary Taylor, report it back with the recommendation that it do pass.

His distinguished services in the war of 1812, the Indian wars, and the Mexican war, and his exalted position as President of the United States, prompt, as a grateful recognition of the patriotic services of this illustrious citizen, the erection of this statue to his memory.

The erection, in this city, of an enduring monument to his worth and services will meet the approval of the entire country.
