Under the southwest corner of the museum is the principal plant, attended by four firemen in severe weather, although not more than two are constantly engage in active service as firemen. One of the firemen is a blacksmith, one a plumber and gas-fitter, a third is a locksmith, and each of these men does mechanical work is addition to his work as fireman.

There is also a hot-air furnace in the laboratory building, for the convenience of the preparators and taxidermists, constantly employed there; and up to July 1, 1889, a portion of the coal burned is chargeable to the armory building, until then largely occupied by Museum workmen, but no longer entirely under the charge of the institution.
