Mr. TURPIE, from the Committee on Pensions, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany S. 329.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill 329, granting to John L. Russell, who served in Capt. Peter Butler's company of mounted rangers in the Black Hawk War, have examined the same, and report that, as shown by the records of the War Department, the claimant was enlisted and served in the Illinois Battalion of Mounted Rangers in the war against Black Hawk and the confederate Indian tribes in 1832. The claimant is now eighty-two years of age; he has no means or property, and is dependent upon friends for his support and maintenance.

In accordance with the precedents in cases of such service, we recommend the passage of the bill.
