Mr. DAVIS (by Mr. MANDERSON), from the Committee on Pensions, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany H. R. 10603.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill granting a pension to Walker H. Fornby, have examined the same and report:

The report of the Committee on Invalid Pensions of the House of Representatives, hereto appended, is adopted, and the bill is recommended to pass.

HOUSE REPORT.

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 10603) to pension Walker H. Fornby, have considered the same and report as follows:

The claimant was a private in Capt. John Loyall's company of Georgia Mounted Volunteers and served from June 9, 1836, to July 7, 1836, in the Creek Indian war.

The testimony before the committee shows that the claimant is about seventy-seven years old, in infirm health and nearly blind; he has no income and is dependent upon his relatives and friends for support.

The passage of the bill is recommended.
