Mr. BROWNE, of Virginia, from the Committee on Pensions, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany H. R. 8262.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 8262) granting a pension to Parker Adams, have considered the same and report as follows:

The claimant was (as shown by the official certificate of the adjutant-general of the State of Illinois) a sergeant in Capt. John Thomas's and Capt. Gideon Simpson's Company, First Regiment Illinois Mounted Volunteer Militia, and served from April 18, 1832, to May 19, 1832, in the Black Hawk War.

The proof filed in support of the bill shows that the soldier is between seventy-five and eighty years old, feeble and sickly, and unable to perform any work. It is further shown that the case is one of necessity, he having no property nor any one upon whom to rely for support.

The passage of the bill is respectfully recommended; amended so as to allow a pension at the rate of \$30 per month.
