Mr. HENDERSON, of North Carolina, from the Committee on Pensions, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany H. R. 10263.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 10263) granting a pension to Robert A. England, have considered the same and report as follows:

The claimant was a private in Capt. John P. Lucus' company of Georgia Volunteers, and served one month and twelve days in the

Creek Indian war of 1836.

It is shown by testimony filed in support of the bill that the claimant is seventy-three years old, and so much disabled by partial blindness and disease of kidneys and bladder that he can do nothing whereby to gain a livelihood. It is further shown that he has a daughter, totally helpless from imbecility, depending upon him for support, and he is in such a condition of destitution that he will soon have to depend upon charity or become a county charge.

In view of the facts stated your committee return the bill with a

favorable recommendation.
