LEGISLATIVE, EXECUTIVE, AND JUDICIAL APPROPRIATION BILL.

JANUARY 26, 1893.—Committed to the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union and ordered to be printed.

Mr. DOCKERY, from the Committee on Appropriations, submitted the following

REPORT:

[To accompany H. R. 10331.]

In presenting the bill making appropriations for the legislative, executive, and judicial expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1894, the Committee on Appropriations submit the following in explanation thereof:

The estimates on which the bill is based will be found on pages 9-68 and 77-83 of the Book of Estimates for 1894, aggregating \$22,625,815.81, of which amount there is recommended in the bill \$21,684,498.82.

The appropriations for the same purposes for the current fiscal year aggregate \$21,900,132.97, being \$215,634.15 more than is recommended in the bill for the service of the fiscal year 1894.

The amount recommended in the bill is \$941,316.99 less than the aggregate estimates submitted. The whole number of salaries specifically provided for in the bill is 10,618, being 224 less than the number estimated for and 116 less than the number provided for in the law for the current year.

Changes in the number or grade of officers or employes of the Government and their rate of compensation, as compared with the current law, are recommended in the bill as follows:

SENATE.

The 37 clerks to Senators who are not chairmen of committees, at \$6 per day during the session, for whom \$26,862 was appropriated for the current year and \$44,520 estimated for the ensuing year, are omitted.

Otherwise the bill appropriates for the officers, clerks, and other employes in the service of the Senate in the same terms as provided in the law for the current year, except that for session employes the usual increase is made in their aggregate compensation growing out of the longer time that they will be employed during the ensuing session as compared with the present session of Congress.

## HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

The amount for compensation of members is increased \$80,000, so as to provide for the additional members authorized under the last apportionment act.

A reduction is made of the assistant clerk to the Committee on War Claims at \$1,200.

Otherwise the bill appropriates for the officers, clerks, and other employés in the service of the House in the same terms as the law for the current year provides, except that for session employés the usual increase is made in their aggregate compensation, growing out of the longer period of time that they will be employed during the ensuing session as compared with the present session of Congress.

## DEPARTMENT OF STATE.

The salaries of one assistant secretary and of the chief clerk are reduced from \$4,500 and \$2,750 to \$3,500 and \$2,500 respectively.

## TREASURY DEPARTMENT.

### SECRETARY'S OFFICE.

In the Division of Mails and Files the salary of one mail messenger is increased from \$1,000 to \$1,200.

### SECOND AUDITOR'S OFFICE.

A reduction is made of five clerks of class 1, at \$1,200 each; and five clerks at \$900 are given in their stead.

### OFFICE OF ASSISTANT TREASURER AT CHICAGO.

For temporary clerical force the sum of \$3,000 is omitted.

### TERRITORY OF UTAH.

The board of five commissioners at \$2,000 each is abolished and their duties devolved upon a board to consist of the governor, chief justice, and secretary of the Territory, who are to serve without additional compensation.

### MINE INSPECTORS.

Three inspectors of mines in the Territories at \$2,000 are omitted, no estimate for them having been submitted for the next fiscal year.

## WAR DEPARTMENT.

## SECRETARY'S OFFICE.

The salary of the chief clerk is reduced from \$2,750 to \$2,500.

## RECORD AND PENSION OFFICE.

One clerk of class 3, \$1,600, one clerk of class 2, \$1,400, one clerk of class 1, \$1,200, and one messenger, at \$840, are transferred to the office of the Inspector-General.

## DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR.

## SECRETARY'S OFFICE.

One special land-inspector at \$2,500 and one census clerk at \$1,800 are omitted.

## GENERAL LAND OFFICE.

A reduction is made of 2 clerks of class 4, at \$1,800 each; 6 clerks of class 3, at \$1,600 each; 14 clerks of class 2, at \$1,400 each; 20 clerks of class 1, at \$1,200 each; 16 clerks at \$1,000 each, and 10 copyists at \$900 each, 68 in all, with salaries aggregating \$81,800.

A reduction is also made in the salary of the chief clerk from \$2,500 to \$2,250.

## PENSION OFFICE.

The salaries of 150 special examiners, at \$1,400 each, are reduced to \$1,300 each.

## BUREAU OF EDUCATION.

The salaries of two laborers, reduced by an error in enrollment to \$420 each for the current year, are restored to \$480 each.

## OFFICE COMMISSIONER OF RAILROADS.

The salary of the engineer at \$2,500 and one copyist at \$900 are omitted, and a clerk of class 1, \$1,200, is provided in lieu of a clerk of class 3 at \$1,600.

## SURVEYORS-GENERAL.

The salaries of the surveyors-general for Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, New Mexico, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming, at \$2,500 each, and for California, at \$2,750, are reduced to \$2,000 each.

## DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE.

The salary of the Solicitor of the Treasury is reduced from \$4,500 to \$4,000.

## LIMITATIONS.

Limitations with reference to appropriations made in the bill, not heretofore imposed, are recommended as follows:

On page 20, after line 5, the following:

*That a joint commission, consisting of three Senators, members of the Fifty-third Congress, to be appointed by the present President of the Senate, and five members-elect to the House of Representatives of the Fifty-third Congress, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Fifty-second Congress, shall, prior to the first Monday of December next, inquire into and examine the status of the laws organizing the Executive Departments, bureaus, divisions, and other Government establishments at the National Capital; the rules, regulations, and methods for the conduct of the same; the time and attention devoted to the operations thereof by the persons employed therein, and the degree of efficiency of all such employes; whether any modification of these laws can be made to secure greater efficiency and economy; and whether a reduction in the number or compensation of the persons authorized to be employed in said Executive Departments or bureaus can be made without injury to the public service. Said Commission, or any subcommittee thereof, shall have power to send for persons and papers, and the Commission may report by bill or otherwise to their respective Houses of the Fifty-third Congress. All necessary expenses of said Commission shall be paid out of the appropriation for the miscellaneous items of the contingent funds of the Senate and House of Representatives upon vouchers approved jointly by the chairmen of said Commission.*

On page 39, after line 13, in connection with the appropriation for salaries in the Bureau of Statistics, the following:

*That the paragraph in section one, subdivision "Bureau of Statistics," of "An act making appropriations for the legislative, executive and judicial expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1893, and for other purposes," approved July 16, 1892, relating to the returns of exports to foreign countries leaving the United States by rail, is hereby amended by striking out the words "verified by oath or affirmation," and substituting in lieu thereof the words "certified as to its accuracy by said person or his agent."*

On page 42, in connection with the office of Supervising Surgeon-General of the Marine-Hospital Service, the following:

*And hereafter the Supervising Surgeon-General of the Marine-Hospital Service is hereby authorized to cause the detail of an additional medical officer and one hospital steward for duty in the Bureau, who shall each receive the pay and allowances of his respective grade in the general service.*

On page 60, after line 6, following the appropriation for legislative expenses for the Territory of Utah, the following:

*That so much of section 9 of the act entitled "An act to amend section 5352 of the Revised Statutes of the United States, in reference to bigamy, and for other purposes," approved March 22, 1882, as authorizes the President to appoint a board of five persons to exercise certain powers and duties prescribed in said section, be, and the same is hereby, repealed, and the said board is hereby abolished, and all powers and duties conferred*

*upon said board are hereby imposed upon and shall be discharged, without additional compensation, by a board hereby created, to be constituted of the governor, chief justice, and secretary of the Territory of Utah.*

On page 89, after line 11, following the appropriation for rent of buildings for the Department of the Interior, the following:

*That the Maltby Building, on and after May 31, 1893, be transferred to the Department of the Interior, to be used and occupied by the Bureau of Education, the Indian Office, and for such portion of the General Land Office as can not be accommodated in the Patent Office building.*

On page 89, in connection with the appropriation for preparing the biennial register for 1893, the following:

*That hereafter the official register of the United States shall contain a statement which will show by Departments or offices, the number of officers and employes in the several Executive Departments, the Department of Labor, the Government Printing Office, and the government of the District of Columbia, appointed from each State and Territory and the District of Columbia, and the aggregate amount of their salaries or compensation.*

On page 93, after line 23, the following:

*That hereafter the Secretary of the Interior be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed, wherever practicable, to consolidate the offices of two or more surveyors-general into one office, and in cases of such consolidation, in the discretion of the Secretary, the surveyor-general appointed in charge of a consolidated office may be paid a salary not exceeding \$2,500 per annum from the sums appropriated respectively for the salaries of the surveyors-general whose offices may be consolidated hereunder.*

On page 107, after line 9, the following:

*That "An act to afford assistance and relief to Congress and the Executive Departments in the investigation of claims and demands against the Government," approved March 3, 1883, is hereby amended by striking out so much of said act as authorizes any committee of the Senate or House of Representatives to refer any claim to the Court of Claims, and also by striking out section 7 of said act.*

On page 108 the following as section 3 of the bill:

*That hereafter it shall be the duty of the heads of the several Executive Departments, in the interest of the public service, to require of all clerks and other employes, of whatever grade or class, in their respective departments, not less than eight hours of labor each day, except Sundays and days declared public holidays by law or executive order: Provided, That the heads of the Departments may, by special order, stating the reason, further extend or limit the hours of service of any clerk or employe in their Departments, respectively; but in case of an extension, it shall be without additional compensation: And provided further, That the Secretary of any Department may grant thirty days' annual and thirty days' sick leave, with pay, in any one year to each clerk or employe, the sick leave to be allowed in cases of personal illness only, or where some member of the immediate family is afflicted with a contagious disease and requires the care and attendance of such employe, or where his or her presence in the Department would jeopardize the health of fellow clerks: And be it further provided, That in exceptional and meritorious cases, where to limit such sick leave would work peculiar hardship, it may be*

*extended in the discretion of the Secretary, with pay, not exceeding sixty days in any one case or in any one calendar year.*

*This section shall not be construed to mean that so long as a clerk or employé is borne upon the rolls of the Department in excess of the time herein provided for, or granted, that he or she shall be entitled to pay during the period of such excessive absence, but that the pay shall stop upon the expiration of the granted leave.*

The following statement shows in detail, by Departments and bureaus or offices and by number of specific salaries, the appropriations for 1893, the estimates submitted for 1894, and the amounts recommended in the accompanying bill:
