#### SUNDRY CIVIL APPROPRIATION BILL.

JANUARY 18, 1893 .- Committed to the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union and ordered to be printed.

Mr. Holman, from the Committee on Appropriations, submitted the following

#### REPORT:

[To accompany H. R. 10238.]

In presenting to the House the bill making appropriations for the sundry civil expenses of the Government for the fiscal year 1894, the Committee on Appropriations submit the following in explanation thereof:

The regular estimates upon which the bill is based will be found on pages 165-183, 184-191, 198, 199, 205, 206, 215-252, of the Book of Estimates for 1894, and aggregate \$38,521,349.30, in addition to which the committee considered sums aggregating \$16,115,750, submitted on page 207 of the Book of Estimates to meet contracts authorized by law for certain river and harbor work, making in all \$54,637,099.30 of estimates considered by the committee as a basis for preparing the bill, of which sum there is recommended \$39,828,834.39, being \$14,808,264.91 less then the estimates.

The sundry civil act for the current fiscal year, 1893, appropriated \$27,665,076.93, which included only \$814,000 for river and harbor

contracts.

The accompanying bill appropriates \$23,713,084.39, exclusive of \$16,115,750 for river and harbor contracts, or \$3,137,992.54 less than the last sundry civil act, after deducting therefrom \$814,000 for river and harbor contracts.

The following limitations touching certain branches of the public service for which appropriations are made, and not heretofore imposed,

are recommended in the bill, namely:

On page 5, in connection with the appropriation for supplies of

light-houses, the following is recommended:

And articles of light-house supply not manufactured in this country may be imported free of duty.

In connection with the appropriation for the Revenue-Cutter Service, the following is recommended, namely:

On page 10:

That collectors of customs or their special deputies shall be competent to administer the oath to officers of the Revenue-Marine Service, required under section 1790, and section 2693 Revised Statutes.

And on page 11:

That the Secretary of the Treasury is hereafter authorized to detail from time to time, as the necessities of the service may require for duty at the seal fisheries in Alaska, officers of the Revenue-Marine Service and special agents of the Treasury authorized to be appointed under section 2649, Revised Statutes of the United States.

On page 22, in connection with the appropriations for field officers and office force of the Coast and Geodetic Survey, the following, which will effect a reduction of \$40,000 in said appropriations in the current

fiscal year, is recommended:

And it shall be the duty of the Superintendent of the Coast and Geodetic Survey to so reduce the number and compensation of the persons now employed as field officers and in the office force as to bring their aggregate compensation for the fiscal year 1894 within the sum of \$222,730; which amount is hereby appropriated for said field officers and office force.

On page 42 the following, which was in the current sundry civil act, is repeated with the word "hereafter" inserted therein, so as to make

it a permanent and continuing provision of law:

That hereafter no employé of the Pinkerton Detective Agency or similar agency shall be employed in any Government service or by any officer

of the District of Columbia.

On page 42, in connection with the appropriation of \$490,000 for salaries and commissions of registers and receivers of land offices, the following is recommended:

And it shall be the duty of the Secretary of the Interior to consolidate the district land officers so as to bring their total compensation for the

fiscal year 1894 within this appropriation.

On page 46, in connection with the appropriation for surveying the

public lands, the following is recommended:

That the States of North Dakota, South Dakota, Montana, Idaho, and Washington shall have a preference right over any person or corporation to select lands granted to said States by the act of Congress approved February 22, 1889, for a period of sixty days after lands have been surveyed and duly declared to be subject to selection and entry under the general land laws of the United States: Provided, That such preference right shall not accrue against bona fide homestead or preëmption settlers on any of said lands at the date of filing of the plat of survey of any township in any local land office of said States.

On page 61, in connection with the appropriation for artificial limbs,

the following is recommended:

And the act entitled "An act to amend section 4787 of the Revised Statutes of the United States," approved March 3, 1891, be, and the same is hereby, repealed, and said section 4787 is hereby re-enacted, to read as follows: Every officer, soldier, seaman, and marine who was disabled during the war for the suppression of the rebellion, in the military or naval service, and in the line of duty, or in consequence of wounds received or disease contracted therein, and who was furnished by the War Department since the seventeenth day of June, eighteen hundred and seventy, with an artificial limb or apparatus for resection, who was entitled to receive such limb or apparatus since said date, shall be entitled to receive a new limb or apparatus at the expiration of every five years thereafter, under such regulations as have been or may be prescribed by the Surgeon-General of the Army.

On page 81, in connection with the appropriation for expenses of Ter-

ritorial courts in Utah, the following is recommended:

That this fund shall only be used for expenses incurred in the enforcement of the laws of the United States and the care and keeping of offenders against the same.
