Mr. SHOUP, from the Committee on Indian Affairs, submitted the following

ADVERSE REPORT:

[To accompany S. 1585.]

The Committee on Indian Affairs, to whom was referred the bill (S. 1585) authorizing the sale of timber on the Jicarilla Apache Indian Reservation for the benefit of the Indians belonging thereto, have examined the same and report that the provisions of this bill have been embodied in the Indian appropriation bill for the fiscal year 1895, limiting the amount of timber to be sold to the amount of \$20,000 in value.

In view of this fact, action on the bill is not necessary, and it is recommended that it be indefinitely postponed.
