ADVERSE REPORT:

[To accompany H. R. 6379.]

The Committee on the Public Lands, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 6379) authorizing settlers on the Cherokee Outlet to commute their homestead entries, and for other purposes, have had the same under consideration and report it back with the recommendation that it do not pass.

The rights sought by this bill have been secured by the Indian appropriation bill for this year.
