Mr. CURTIS, of Kansas, from the Committee on Indian Affairs, submitted the following

### REPORT:

[To accompany H. R. 7450.]

The Committee on Indian Affairs, to which was referred the bill (H. R. 7450) granting to the Northern Mississippi Railway Company a right of way through the Leech Lake Indian, Chippewa Indian, and Winnebagoish Indian reservations, in the State of Minnesota, having had the same under consideration report as a substitute therefor S. 2107, which has passed that body and reported to the House, with the recommendation that it do pass.

The bill herewith reported has the approval of the Secretary of the Interior, and conforms in all respects to the recent acts of Congress granting right of way for railway purposes through Indian reservations.

The Senate bill No. 2107 passed the House August 10, instant.
