LETTER FROM THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL, TRANSMITTING, IN RESPONSE TO SENATE RESOLUTION OF MAY 18, 1896, A LIST OF ALL JUDGMENTS RENDERED BY THE COURT OF CLAIMS IN FAVOR OF CLAIMANTS SINCE APRIL 6, 1896, IN INDIAN DEPREDAATION CASES.

DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE,
Washington, D. C., May 21, 1896.

SIR: I am in receipt of the following resolution of the Senate under date of the 18th instant:

Resolved, That the Attorney-General of the United States be, and he is hereby, requested to transmit to the Senate a list of all judgments rendered by the Court of Claims in favor of claimants since the sixth day of April, eighteen hundred and ninety-six, in Indian depredation cases, including the names of claimants, the amount claimed, and the amount of judgment recorded in each case.

In compliance with the terms of said resolution I herewith submit a list of all judgments rendered by the Court of Claims in favor of claimants since the 6th day of April, 1896, in Indian depredation cases.
