Mr. GALLINGEE, from the Committee on Pensions, submitted the following

REPORT.

[To accompany H. R. 5083.]

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 5083) granting a pension to Thomas Lane, have examined the same, and report:

The report of the Committee on Invalid Pensions of the House of Representatives, hereto appended, is adopted, and the passage of the bill is recommended.

HOUSE REPORT.

The claimant was a private in Captain Moore's company of Illinois Volunteers, and served for thirty-one days in the Sac and Fox Indian war of 1831. In addition to the above service, he was allowed twenty days' travel pay. These facts are shown by the records of the Treasury Department.

Mr. Lane's claim at the Pension Bureau, under the Indian war act of July 27, 1892, was rejected on the ground that the service was rendered prior to 1832, that act making provision only for the survivors of the Indian wars from 1832 to 1842, inclusive.

The claimant is now nearly 90 years old, and unable to maintain himself by manual labor. These facts are fully shown by the papers on file at the Pension Office.

The passage of the bill is recommended.
