Mr. FISCHER, from the Committee on Indian Affairs, submitted the  
following

REPORT.

[To accompany H. R. 4769.]

The Committee on Indian Affairs, to whom was referred House bill  
4769, submit the following report:

The Gila Valley, Globe and Northern Railway Company, under  
authority granted by Congress February 18, 1895, have constructed  
and are operating a railroad from Bowie Station, on the Southern  
Pacific Railroad, to the southern line of the San Carlos Indian Reser-  
vation, but have not constructed beyond that point, although author-  
ized so to do, because of the inability to procure consent from the  
Indians on that reservation as therein required; and as the time  
for completion of said road is about to expire, through no apparent  
fault upon the part of the corporation, an extension of time is asked  
for; and the Committee on Indian Affairs beg to favorably report said  
bill with an amendment, striking out the word "four" in line 11 of  
page 1, and insert in lieu thereof the word "two."
