# LEGISLATIVE, EXECUTIVE, AND JUDICIAL APPROPRIATION BILL.

January 5, 1899.—Committed to the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union and ordered to be printed.

Mr. BINGHAM, from the Committee on Appropriations, submitted the following

### REPORT.

[To accompany H. R. 11414.]

In presenting the bill making appropriations for the legislative, executive, and judicial expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1900, the Committee on Appropriations submit the

following in explanation thereof:

The estimates on which the bill is based will be found on pages 9-77 and 89-92 of the Book of Estimates for 1900, and aggregate \$24,365,005.86, of which amount there is recommended in the bill \$23,229,237.46. The appropriations for the same purposes for the current fiscal year, including \$1,707,166.50 carried in the sundry civil and deficiency acts, aggregated \$23,333,013.15, being \$103,775.69 more than is recommended in the bill for the service of the fiscal year 1900.

The total amount recommended in the bill is \$1,135,768.40 less than

the aggregate of the estimates submitted.

The whole number of salaries specifically provided for in the bill is 750 less than the number estimated for, and, including 99 heretofore paid from the general appropriation for the care of the Congressional Library building and grounds, is 200 more than the number provided for in the law for the current year.

Changes in the number or grade of officers or employees of the Government and their rate of compensation, as compared with the

current law, are recommended in the bill as follows:

#### SENATE.

The bill appropriates for the officers, clerks, and other employees in the service of the Senate in the same terms as the law for the current year, except that for session employees the usual increase in their aggregate compensation is made, growing out of the longer term of employment during the ensuing session as compared with the present short session of Congress.

#### HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

A janitor for the room of the Committee on Ways and Means is provided for at \$720, and provision is made for the assistant clerk and stenographer to the Committee on Appropriations at \$2,000, instead of \$1,600. A clerk to the Committee on Elections at \$2,000 is provided for, instead of a clerk to each of the Committees on Elections, Nos. 1, 2, and 3, at \$2,000 each. Appropriations are recommended for the minority employees authorized in the resolution of the House of March 20, 1897, from the adjournment of the present session of Congress until January 4, 1900, and for the assistant department messenger authorized by the resolution of the House of December 7, 1897, from the adjournment of the present session until the close of the fiscal year 1900.

#### OFFICE OF PUBLIC PRINTER.

The salary of the chief clerk is provided for at \$2,500 instead of \$2,400.

#### LIBRARY OF CONGRESS.

The salary of one assistant is provided for at \$2,000 instead of \$1,800, and a superintendent of the art department at \$2,000 is recommended.

#### EXECUTIVE OFFICE.

Two additional messengers at \$900 each and a laborer at \$720 are provided for.

### STATE DEPARTMENT.

The salary of the private secretary to the Secretary of State is reduced from \$2,400 to \$2,250.

#### TREASURY DEPARTMENT.

Office of the Secretary.—The salary of the clerk to the Secretary of

the Treasury is reduced from \$2,400 to \$2,250.

Office of chief clerk.—An additional elevator conductor at \$720, two firemen at \$720 each for the Winder Building, and three watchmenfiremen at \$720 each and one laborer at \$660, for the Cox Building, rented for use of the Treasury Department, are provided for.

Division of customs.—An additional clerk at \$1,000 is recommended. Division of loans and currency.—Two additional clerks at \$900 each and six additional paper counters and laborers at \$620 each, rendered necessary because of increase of work incident to the war with Spain, are provided for.

An assistant messenger at \$720 and a laborer at \$660, now borne on

the honorable service roll, are omitted.

Miscellaneous division.—A clerk at \$900, borne on the honorable serv-

ice roll, is omitted.

Office of Comptroller of the Treasury.—Two clerks of class 2, at \$1,400 each, instead of two clerks of class 1, at \$1,200 each, and one laborer at \$660 are provided for.

Office of Auditor for Treasury Department.—Three clerks of class 1, at \$1,200 each, rendered necessary by increase of work incident to the war with Spain, are provided for for the twelve months beginning April 1, 1899.

Two clerks at \$900 each, borne on the honorable service roll, are

omitted.

Office of Auditor for War Department.—The additional force rendered necessary because of increased work incident to the war with Spain, provided for in a deficiency act until March 31, 1899, is continued for one year from that date, together with ten clerks at \$1,000 each, ten clerks at \$900 each, and three laborers at \$660 each. The aggregate of salaries for all of said force is \$112,580.

Office of Auditor for Navy Department.—The additional clerical force rendered necessary because of increased work incident to the war with Spain, provided for in a deficiency act until March 31, 1899, is continued for twelve months from that date, at salaries aggregating

\$21,800.

Office of Auditor for Interior Department.—Four clerks at \$900 each,

borne on the honorable service roll, are omitted.

Office of Auditor for Post Office Department.—A law clerk at \$2,000, two clerks of class 3, at \$1,600 each; three clerks of class 2, at \$1,400 each, and four clerks of class 1, at \$1,200 each, additional are provided for.

One clerk at \$900 and one money-order assorter at \$720, borne on

the honorable service roll, are omitted.

Office of the Treasurer.—Three clerks of class 1 at \$1,200 each, two clerks at \$1,000 each, two clerks at \$900 each, one pressman at \$1,200, and one charwoman at \$240 in the national currency redemption division are provided for.

Office of Register of the Treasury.—Three clerks of class 1 at \$1,200 each and three clerks at \$1,000 each, rendered necessary because of

increased work incident to the war with Spain, are provided for.

Office of Commissioner of Internal Revenue.—Three clerks at \$900

each, borne on the honorable-service roll, are omitted.

The sum of \$650,000 is recommended for additional clerks and other employees in the office of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue, and for salaries and expenses of increased force of deputy collectors, rendered necessary by the act of June 30, 1898, providing for war expenditures.

Office of Light-House Board.—Two additional clerks at \$1,000 each are provided for.

Bureau of Statistics.—A translator at \$1,200 is provided for.

Office of Construction of Standard Weights and Measures.—An inspector of standards at \$3,000 and one adjuster's helper at \$720 are provided for.

Office of Supervising Surgeon-General Marine-Hospital Service.—A chief clerk at \$2,000 and a laborer at \$480 instead of \$360 are pro-

vided for.

Bureau of Immigration.—The salary of the chief clerk is raised from \$2,000 to \$2,250, and one supervising immigrant inspector, to be attached to the Bureau in Washington for special work outside, at \$1,600 is provided for.

INDEPENDENT TREASURY.

Office of Assistant Treasurer at Chicago.—One vault clerk at \$1,800 and one clerk at \$1.200, additional, are provided for.

Office of Assistant Treasurer at New York.—Four assistant tellers at \$900 and four assistant tellers at \$800 each, additional, are provided for.

#### MINTS AND ASSAY OFFICES.

No appropriations are recommended for operation of the Assay Office at Deadwood, South Dakota.

#### WAR DEPARTMENT.

Office of the Secretary.—An appointment clerk at \$2,000 in lieu of a clerk at \$1,800, a librarian at \$1,800 in lieu of a clerk at \$1,200, and one additional clerk of class 2 at \$1,400 are provided for; and the salary of the clerk to the Assistant Secretary is increased from \$1,800 to \$2,100.

The sum of \$450,000 is recommended for the employment during the nine months beginning July 1, 1899, of such additional temporary force of clerks, messengers, laborers, and other assistants as in the judgment of the Secretary of War may be proper and necessary to the prompt, efficient, and accurate dispatch of official business in the War Department and its bureaus, to be allotted by the Secretary of War to such bureaus and offices as the exigencies of the needs of the service may demand.

Record and Pension Office.—In lieu of the force now employed in the work of preparation, publication, and distribution of the Official Records of the Union and Confederate Armies, the 21 employees, with salaries aggregating \$29,080, recommended by the Secretary of War, are provided for in this office.

Office of Judge-Advocate-General.—One additional clerk of class 4 at

\$1,800 is provided for.

#### PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS.

A landscape gardener at \$2,000 is provided for, instead of a public gardener at \$1,800.

#### NAVY DEPARTMENT.

Office of the Secretary.—Two clerks of class 4 at \$1,800 each are provided for in lieu of one clerk at \$2,250 and one clerk at \$1,600.

Office of Judge-Advocate-General.—An additional clerk of class 3 at

\$1,600 is provided for.

Office of Naval Intelligence.—One clerk of class 3 at \$1,600, one clerk of class 2 at \$1,400, one translator at \$1,400, one assistant draftsman at \$1,200, three clerks at \$1,000 each, and one laborer at \$660, in all \$9,260, are provided for in this office in lieu of persons employed therein on detail.

Naval Observatory.—A fireman at \$720 is provided for, and a laborer at \$660 is omitted.

Bureau of Supplies and Accounts.—An additional laborer at \$660 is provided for.

The salaries of the nine chief clerks of bureaus of the Navy Department are provided for at \$2,000 each, instead of at \$1,800 each.

### DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR.

Office of the Secretary.—A chief of division at \$2,000, one clerk of class 4 at \$1,800, one clerk of class 3 at \$1,600, two clerks of class 1 at \$1,200 each, and one copyist at \$900, in all \$8,700, are provided for, to constitute a division in charge of Indian affairs, rendered necessary by the passage of the act of June 28, 1898.

Indian Office.—Three clerks of class 3 at \$1,600 each and five clerks at \$900 each, in all \$9,300, are provided for, being rendered necessary

by the passage of the act approved June 28, 1898.

Patent Office.—Twenty additional copyists at \$900 each, in lieu of twenty five copyists at \$720 each, are provided for.

Office of Assistant Treasurer at Philadelphia.—One clerk at \$1,200 and one counter at \$900, additional, are provided for.

#### POST-OFFICE DEPARTMENT.

Office of First Assistant Postmaster-General.—The salary of the chief of the salary and allowance division is increased from \$2,500 to \$3,000, and the sum of \$13,400 is recommended for the employment during the nine months beginning July 1, 1899, of such additional temporary force of clerks and other employees as in the judgment of the Postmaster-General may be proper and necessary to the prompt, efficient, and accurate dispatch of the business in the office of the First Assistant Postmaster-General.

Office of Second Assistant Postmaster-General.—Three additional

clerks at \$1,000 each are provided for.

Office of Third Assistant Postmaster-General.—One additional clerk

of class 3, \$1,600 is recommended.

Office of Fourth Assistant Postmaster-General.—Three additional clerks, at \$900 each, and one additional laborer, at \$660, are provided for.

#### DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE.

An assistant attorney in charge of dockets, at \$2,500, is provided for, the salary of the Solicitor for the Department of State is increased from \$3,500 to \$4,000, and the salary of the private secretary to the Attorney-General is reduced from \$2,400 to \$2,250.

#### LIMITATIONS.

Limitations with respect to appropriations made in the bill, not heretofore imposed, are recommended as follows:

In connection with the appropriation for the office of the Comptroller

of the Treasury the following:

Clerks and other employees provided for by this act for the office of the Comptroller of the Treasury and for the offices of the six Auditors of the Treasury for the several Executive Departments shall be exclusively engaged on the work of said offices for the fiscal year 1900.

In connection with the appropriations for contingent expenses of the

Treasury Department, the following:

No money appropriated by this act shall be used for expense of repairing recording clocks used for recording time of clerks or other employees in any of the Executive Departments at Washington, nor shall there hereafter be used in any of the Executive Departments at Washington any such recording clocks.

In connection with the appropriations recommended for the mint at

Carson, Nev., the following:

And the Secretary of the Treasury is hereby authorized, in his discretion, to supply the mint at Carson with silver bullion for conversion into standard silver dollars and all smaller denominations of silver.

If, in the discretion of the Secretary of the Treasury, the mint at Carson, Nev., be not operated as a coinage mint during the whole or any part of the fiscal year 1900, the foregoing appropriations for said mint shall only be available during the fiscal year 1900, or such part of said year as the said mint is not operated for coinage purposes, for maintaining the same as an assay office and as follows:

For assayer in charge, who shall also perform the duties of melter, \$2,000; assistant assayer and one clerk, at \$1,500 each; for wages of workmen and watchmen, \$7,500; for incidental and contingent expenses,

\$3,000; in all, \$15,500.

In connection with the appropriations for the office of the Secretary

of the Navy, the following:

The Secretary of the Navy is hereby authorized and directed to

submit in the annual estimates for the fiscal year 1901 estimates for all such additional clerks and other employees that he shall deem requisite for the regular and permanent work of the Navy Department, such estimates for clerks and other employees to include all persons carried upon the rolls of the Department and paid from appropriations for increase of the Navy or from other general appropriations, and who may be engaged upon and required for the regular and permanent work of said Department.

In connection with the appropriation for rent of buildings for the

Interior Department, the following:

That the appropriation of \$10,000 made by the deficiency appropriation act approved July 7, 1898, to furnish the old Post-Office Department building when vacated by the Postmaster-General is made available also for repairs of said building that may be found essential to prepare it for occupancy by offices of the Interior Department, and said appropriation, together with the appropriation of \$5,000 made by said act for expense of removal of offices of the Interior Department to said building, are hereby made available during the fiscal year 1900.

In connection with the appropriation for the office of the First

Assistant Postmaster-General the following:

The assistant superintendents of the free delivery system shall hereafter be allowed a per diem of \$4 in lieu of all expenses when traveling on business of the Department or when detailed for duty away from headquarters at Washington, D. C.

In connection with the appropriations for the Court of Private Land

Claims, the following:

That section 19 of an act entitled "An act to establish a Court of Private Land Claims and to provide for the settlement of private land claims in certain States and Territories," approved March 3, 1891, as amended in legislative, executive, and judicial appropriation act for the fiscal year 1898, approved February 19, 1897, be, and the same is hereby, further amended to read as follows:

SEC. 19. That the powers and functions of the court established by this act shall cease and determine on the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred, and all papers, files, and records in the possession of the said court belonging to any other public office of the United States shall be returned to such office, and all other papers, files, and records in the possession of or appertaining to said court shall be returned to and filed in the Department of the Interior.

### As section 3 of the bill, the following:

Sec. 3. That the additional clerks and other employees rendered necessary because of increased work incident to the war with Spain, including the temporary force of clerks and other employees in the War Department and the Post-Office Department, the additional clerks and other employees in the office of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue and the increased force of deputy collectors of internal revenue, appropriated for by this Act, shall be appointed for a term not exceeding one year, as authorized, respectively, without compliance with the conditions prescribed by the act entitled "An act to regulate and improve the civil service," approved January sixteenth, eighteen hundred and eighty-three.

### As section 4 of the bill, the following:

SEC. 4. The appropriations herein made for the officers, clerks, and persons employed in the public service shall not be available for the compensation of any persons permanently incapacitated by age or otherwise for employment in such service. The establishment of a civil pension roll or an honorable service roll, or the exemption of any of the officers, clerks, and persons in the public service from the existing laws respecting employment in such service, is hereby prohibited.
