The Committee on Indian Affairs, to whom was referred the bill
(H. R. 11621) entitled "A bill authorizing the St. Louis, Tecumseh and
Lexington Railway Company to construct and operate a railway through
the Territory of Oklahoma, and for other purposes," beg leave to recom-
mend that said bill do pass.

This is a bill enacting that said railway company shall have the right
to construct a railway through said Territory, and the committee find
that it conforms to all the rules and precedents in such cases.
