In mking out the above statement it has been assumed that the resolution of the Senate designed also to embrace the moneys advanced to disburing officers during the present year out of previous permanent appropriations, such as those under the act of the 15th May, 1828, and

7th June, 1832; they have therefore been included.

It is proper also to add, that in arriving at the amount of payments made on contracts, and of advances to disbursing officers, out of appropriations made at the late session of Congress, the sums remaining unexpended of former appropriations for the same objects, together with the amounts refunded and credited to said appropriations during the present year, have been first absorbed, and the sums above stated constitute those paid on contracts and advanced to disbursing officers out of the appropriation at the late session of Congress.
