### DECEMBER 13, 1836.

1. Resolved, That so much of the President's message as relates to the political relations of the United States with foreign nations, be referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs.

2. Resolved, That so much of the said message as relates to the commerce of the United States with foreign nations and their dependencies,

be referred to the Committee on Commerce.

3. Resolved, That so much of the said message as relates to the finances, and every thing connected therewith; the safe-keeping of the public moneys, and every thing connected therewith; and the Bank of the United States, including the stock of the United States in that institution, be referred to the Committee of Ways and Means.

4. Resolved, That so much of the said message as relates to the public lands, and all things connected therewith, be referred to the Committee

on the Public Lands.

5. Resolved, That so much of said message as relates to the report of the Secretary of War, and the public interest intrusted to the War Department, except so much thereof as relates to Indian affairs, beireferred to the Committee on Military Affairs.

6. Resolved, That so much of the said message as relates to the militia of

the United States, be referred to the Committee on the Militia.

7. Resolved, That so much of the said message as relates to the Indian tribes, except what relates to the taking the property of individuals for public use, and the relief of sufferers by Indian depredations, or by the operations of our own troops in Florida, Alabama, and Georgia, be referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs.

8. Resolved, That so much of the said message as relates to the taking the property of individuals for public use, and the relief of sufferers by Indian depredations, or by the operations of our own troops in Florida, Ala-

bama, and Georgia, be referred to the Committee on Claims.

9. Resolved, That so much of the said message as relates to the report of the Secretary of the Navy, and the public interest intrusted to the Navy

Department, be referred to the Committee on Naval Affairs.

10. Resolved, That so much of the said message as relates to the report of the Postmaster General, the condition and operations of the Post Office Department, and every thing connected therewith, be referred to the Committee on the Post Office and Post Roads.
