Mr. STEPHENS, from the Committee on Indian Affairs, submitted the following

REPORT.

[To accompany H. R. 12112.]

The Committee on Indian Affairs, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 12112) entitled "An Act to grant the right of way through the Indian Territory to the Denison, Bonham and New Orleans Railway Company for the purpose of constructing a railway, and for other purposes," approved March 28, 1898, and to vest in The Denison, Bonham and Gulf Railway Company all the rights, privileges, and franchises therein granted to said first-named company, report the same back to the House with the recommendation that it do pass with the following amendment:

Amend line 2, page 2, by adding after the word "Company," in said line, the following: "the successor of the aforesaid railroad company."
