WAR DEPARTMENT, Washington, D. C., December 19, 1896.

SIR: I have the honor to transmit herewith a letter from the Chief of Engineers, United States Army, dated December 10, 1896, with accompanying copy of House Ex. Doc. No. 307, Fifty-third Congress, third session, urging action for the protection of the interests of the United States in the sale and disposal of certain lands situated in the Chippewa Indian Reservation in the State of Minnesota.

These lands are subject to overflow as a result of the construction and maintenance of reservoirs at the headwaters of the Mississippi River by the United States. The Indian owners have already been paid in full for the damages inflicted, and it is important that precautions be taken to avoid incurring any liability for damages to the future purchasers of the land. The Secretary of the Interior has expressed the opinion that action by Congress is necessary to protect the public interests, and in view of the facts favorable consideration of the subject at the present session of Congress is recommended.

The inclosed document explains the nature of the legislation desired.

Sir: I have the honor to invite attention to certain correspondence contained in House Ex. Doc. No. 307, Fifty-third Congress, third session,

a copy of which is herewith.

In that correspondence it was urged by the War Department that Congress take some action for the protection of the interests of the United States in the sale and disposal of certain lands situated in the Chippewa Indian Reservation in the State of Minnesota. In letters of January 7, 1892, and February 6, 1895, from this office, which are printed in the aforesaid executive document, a full explanation of the nature of the legislation desired, and of the reasons and necessity therefor, is given. There is also printed in the document a draft of a bill which it is believed will, if enacted, effectuate the purpose in view.

It is deemed proper to say that the Secretary of the Interior, in correspondence with the War Department, has expressed his approval of the proposed legislation, and his concurrence in the opinion that some action by Congress on this line is necessary to protect the public

interests.

It appears from a recent letter from the Secretary of the Interior to the Secretary of War that the lands in question will soon be ready for disposal, and it is important therefore that the subject should receive

consideration at the present session of Congress.

I beg to recommend, therefore, that the matter be again brought to the attention of Congress, and that in view of the magnitude of the public interests involved favorable action at the present session, along the lines set forth in the aforesaid executive document, be urged.

SIR: Under date of January 7, 1892, I addressed a letter to the Secretary of War, as follows:

When the construction of reservoirs at the head waters of the Mississippi River was undertaken by the United States for the improvement of navigation it was known that certain lands situated within the Chippewa Indian Reservation, in the State of Minnesota, would be subject to overflow, and consequent damage, as a result of the construction and maintenance of these reservoirs. These damages were appraised by commissioners appointed in accordance with law for that purpose, and by act of Congress approved August 19, 1890, the sum of \$150,000 was appropriated to pay the Chippewa Indians in full for all claims for damages sustained by them on account of said reservoirs.

The act of Congress approved January 14, 1889, provides for the transfer of these Indian lands to the United States and for the disposal thereof to private citizens under the provisions of the homestead law. The act contains no provision to preclude claims for damages on the part of persons who may purchase the land under the statutory provisions, and such purchasers would hold the title so obtained without qualification and with nothing to restrain them from claiming damages for any loss suffered by reason of the operation and maintenance of dams and reservoirs. As the Indian owners of these lands have already been paid in full for the damages inflicted, it is important that proper precautions be taken to avoid incurring any liability for the same damages to the future purchasers of the lands. It appears, therefore, to be necessary that Congress, by further legislation, should provide that when these Indian lands are disposed of under the provisions of the act of January 14, 1889, the title granted by the United States shall convey to the holder no right to claim remuneration for damages resulting from the construction, operation, and maintenance by the Government of dams and reservoirs at the head waters of the Mississippi River and its tributaries.

A list of these lands is submitted herewith with recommendation that it be transmitted to Congress with request that the act of January 14, 1889, entitled "An act for the relief and civilization of the Chippewa Indians in the State of Minnesota," be so amended that the lands enumerated in this list shall at all times remain subject to the right of the United States to construct and maintain dams for the purpose of creating reservoirs in aid of navigation, and no claim or right of compensation shall accrue from the overflowing of said lands on account of the construction and

maintenance of such dams and reservoirs.

Subsequently I submitted a draft of a bill to effectuate the purpose set forth in the foregoing letter and stated that should this proposed bill be enacted into law a new and revised list of the lands in question would be carefully prepared, under the supervision of this office, for file in the General Land Office, in accordance with the provisions of section 2 of the said bill.

The papers were transmitted to Congress by the Secretary of War December 9, 1892, where they were referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs and printed in House Ex. Doc. No. 124, Fifty-second Congress,

second session.

It is proper to state that this action was taken after correspondence with the Secretary of the Interior, who expressed his approval of the proposed legislation and his concurrence in my opinion that some action by Congress on this line was necessary to protect the interests of the United States.

So far as known no action has been taken by Congress, and the time is fast approaching when these lands will have to be disposed of under

the act of January 14, 1889.

The magnitude of the interest involved renders it important to the United States that some legislation on this subject be had, and I beg to recommend that the views of the Department contained in the aforesaid House Ex. Doc. No. 124, Fifty-second Congress, second session, be brought to the attention of the chairman of the Committee on Indian Affairs of the House of Representatives, with a view to securing action at the present session of Congress.

SIR: I have the honor to inclose a copy of a letter from the Chief of Engineers, addressed to me on January 7, 1892, recommending for the reasons therein given that the act of Congress approved January 14, 1889, entitled "An act for the relief and civilization of the Chippewa Indians in the State of Minnesota" (25 Stats., 642), be amended so as to provide that the Indian lands subject to overflow by the construction and operation of reservoirs at the head waters of the Mississippi River, enumerated in inclosure to this letter, shall at all times remain subject to the right of the United States to construct and maintain dams for the purpose of creating reservoirs in aid of navigation, etc., and to accomplish which he submits for the consideration of Congress the inclosed draft of a bill.

The Chief of Engineers in submitting this draft states that if it is enacted into law a new and revised list of the lands to be affected by it would be carefully prepared in his office for file in the General Land Office of the Department of the Interior, as it is probable that a number of changes would be made in the list of lands now submitted.

Whereas an act of Congress entitled "An act for the relief and civilization of the Chippewa Indians in the State of Minnesota," approved January fourteenth, eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, provides for the cession to the United States of certain lands belonging to the Chippewa Indians, in the State of Minnesota, and further provides for the sale and disposal of the said lands by the United States in a manner fully set forth and described in the said act: and Whereas certain parcels of the said lands have been damaged and are liable

to damage by overflow by reason of the construction, operation, and maintenance by the United States of dams and reservoirs, in aid of navigation, at the head

by the United States of dams and reservoirs, in and of havigation, at the head waters of the Mississippi River: Therefore,

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of

America in Congress assembled, That all the lands thus damaged and liable to

damage by overflow shall at all times remain subject to the right of the United States to construct and maintain dams for the purpose of creating reservoirs in aid of navigation, and no claim or right of compensation shall accrue from the overflowing of said lands on account of the construction and maintenance of such dams and reservoirs.

SEC. 2. That the Secretary of War shall furnish the Commissioner of the General Land Office a list of such lands, with the particular tracts appropriately described, and in the disposal of each and every one of said tracts, whether by sale, by allotment in severalty to individual Indians, or otherwise, under the provision of the aforementioned act of Congress of January fourteenth, eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, the provisions of the above section one of this act shall enter into and form a part of the contract of purchase or transfer of title.
