REPORT :

The Committee of Claims, to whom was referred the petition of John Cocke, praying an equitable settlement of his accounts as agent to treat with the Cherokee Indians in 1827, report :

That the petitioner received a sum of money as Indian agent, and failing to account for it to the satisfaction of the department, was sued and a verdict rendered against him. The committee, seeing no reason for interfering with this decision, and believing it just, recommend the adoption of the following resolution :

Resolved, That the prayer of the petition ought not to be granted.
