REPORT:

[To accompany joint resolution No. 39.]

The Committee on Indian Affairs, to whom was referred the memorial of the Biloxi Bay Indians, a portion of the Choctaws, have considered the same, and report :

That the facts constituting the basis of their claim are, with the reasons in favor of them, stated in the memorial of said claimants, and a letter of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs to the Secretary of the Interior dated March 1, 1851, to which the committee refers, and which, with the recommendation contained in said letter, are adopted as their report, marked A and B. The committee therefore report the accompanying resolution.
