RESOLUTIONS

OF THE

LEGISLATURE OF NEW YORK,

IN RELATION TO

Granting pensions to soldiers of the Indian wars of 1791-2-4 and 5, and to the widows of the deceased soldiers of those wars.

JANUARY 31, 1855.—Laid upon the table, and ordered to be printed.

CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS.

IN ASSEMBLY, *January 8, 1855.*

Resolved (if the Senate concur,) That our senators in Congress be instructed, and our representatives requested, to use their influence to procure the passage of a law granting a pension to the surviving soldiers of the Indian wars of 1791-2-4 and 5, and to the widows of the deceased soldiers of those wars.

Resolved (if the Senate concur,) That the governor be requested to forward copies of these resolutions to each of our senators and representatives in Congress.
