A grant to that State of the 16th and 36th sections of land on the Indian reservations, or other public lands in lieu thereof, for the benefit of common schools in that State.

FEBRUARY 8, 1866.—Referred to the Committee on Public Lands and ordered to be printed.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION No. 5.

Whereas, by reason of a number of Indian reservations in the State of Kansas, the State has not received the full amount of land for the use of common schools the State is entitled to: Therefore—

Resolved by the house of representatives, (the senate concurring therein,) That we respectively memorialize Congress to grant to the State, for the use of common schools, the 16th and 36th sections on the Indian reservations, or an equivalent thereto, from the public lands, when the treaties are effected with the several Indian tribes and reserves surveyed.

Resolved, That the secretary of state be requested to forward copies of these resolutions to our senators and representatives in Congress.
