So amending the provisions of the land grant to the Leavenworth, Lawrence and Fort Gibson railroad, together with a branch from Lawrence to Emporia, as to make Burlingame a point on said road.

FEBRUARY 13, 1866.—Referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs and ordered to be printed.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION No. 23.

Whereas Congress has made a land grant to the Leavenworth, Lawrence and Fort Gibson railroad, together with a branch from Lawrence to Emporia; and whereas Burlingame, the county seat of Osage county, lies nearly on a line between Lawrence and Emporia; and whereas the settlers of Osage county believe that they have a right to the benefit of said road in preference to speculators who own nearly all the middle and southern part of said county: Therefore,

Resolved by the house of representatives, (the senate concurring therein,) That Congress is hereby respectfully memorialized to so alter the provisions of the grant for said branch as to make Burlingame a point on said road; and we earnestly request our senators and representatives in Congress to use their influence to get the said alteration made.

Resolved, That the secretary of state is hereby directed to forward copies of the foregoing resolution to the President of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and to our senators and representatives in Congress.
