RESOLUTIONS
OF
THE LEGISLATURE OF KANSAS,
IN FAVOR OF

A grant of lands to that State for school purposes, as an equivalent for the sixteenth and thirty-sixth sections disposed of by the government.

FEBRUARY 20, 1867.—Referred to the Committee on Public Lands and ordered to be printed.

Whereas a large amount of lands have been lost to the public school fund of the State of Kansas by the disposal and occupancy of Indian reservations within the limits of said State : Therefore,

Resolved by the senate, (the house of representatives concurring,) That Congress be hereby memorialized : First, to grant to the State of Kansas for school purposes, from the public lands now surveyed or which may be surveyed within the bounds of the State, an equivalent for the sixteenth and thirty-sixth sections of the reservations already disposed of by the United States government and lying within the limits of the State of Kansas.

Second. That in all future treaties of Congress with Indian tribes holding reservations within the bounds of the State of Kansas, the sixteenth and thirty-sixth sections of said reservation be set apart for the use of common schools.

Third. *Resolved,* That upon the passage of this resolution, the secretary of state be requested to furnish a copy of the same to each of our senators and representatives in Congress.
