MEMORIAL

OF

THE LEGISLATURE OF WISCONSIN

IN FAVOR OF

The removal of certain bands of Indians from that State.

MARCH 31, 1870.—Referred to the Committee on Appropriations and ordered to be printed.

To the honorable the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States in Congress assembled :

The memorial of the legislature of the State of Wisconsin respectfully represents: That the interests of the residents of the northern and north-western portions of this State, as well as the interests of the stray bands of Indians therein, imperatively demand that the said stray bands of Indians be removed and located upon reservation at or near the headwaters of the Eau Plaine River, in the northern portion of the State.

His excellency, the governor, is respectfully requested to forward to each of our members in Congress at Washington, to the Secretary of the Interior, and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, a copy of this memorial.
