## PREFACE

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The general plan of the "consolidated index of Congressional documents" having proved acceptable to those who consult the index, the present issue has been compiled after the same manner as those for preceding sessions of Congress.

First, there is an alphabetical arrangement in which documents of both Senate and House are entered under their subject or subjects and under the names of those presenting them; but under Departments and bureaus, lists of publications are as a rule omitted, as are also entries under names of personal authors, except Congressmen. In this same alphabet committee reports of Senate and House are entered under names of Congressmen submitting them, under names of committees, and under the subject or subjects of the reports. Committee reports are numbered consecutively through a Congress, but documents are numbered only through a particular session. Bills and resolutions, like reports, have only one numerical series during a Congress, but such bills and resolutions receive no entries in this index, except that in the alphabetical list their numbers are added to all entries for the reports made upon them.

The following abbreviations for documents, reports, bills, and resolutions have been adopted by this office, namely: S. doc. and H. doc. for Senate and House documents; S. rp. and H. rp. for Senate and House reports; S. and H. for Senate and House bills; S. R. and H. R. for Senate and House simple resolutions; S. J. R. and H. J. R. for Senate and House joint resolutions; and S. C. R. and H. C. R. for Senate and House concurrent resolutions.

The alphabetical arrangement is followed by a numerical arrangement under the four series in which Congressional documents exclusive of bills and resolutions have been issued since the beginning of the Fifty-fourth Congress, namely: Senate documents, Senate reports, House documents, and House reports, giving in each instance the number of the document or report, its title or subject, and the number of the volume of the Congressional reserve in which it will be bound. This numerical list has proved to be a very valuable addition to the Index.

The schedule of volumes for the Congressional reserve follows the numerical arrangement, and includes, as did the Index for the first session of the Fifty-fifth Congress, the serial number for each volume as adopted by this office in the Checklist of Public Documents.

Section 57 of the printing law of January 12, 1895, provides that 144 copies of the Journals of the Senate and House of Representatives shall be delivered to the Superintendent of Documents "to be distributed to three libraries in each of the States and Territories, to be designated by the Superintendent of Documents" (Stat. L., v. 28, p. 609). No provision therefore is made to supply every designated depository with these journals, and for this reason serial numbers were for a time not assigned to Senate and House Journals. Serial numbers for those of the second session have, however, been assigned, the Senate Journal bearing the number 3589 and the House Journal 3628. Notes to this effect will be found in the schedule of volumes appended to this Index.

This Index, the fourth that has been issued by this office, includes all documents and reports submitted to Congress from December 6, 1897, to July 8, 1898, the period covered by the second session of the Fifty-fifth Congress. It includes entries for 345 Senate documents, 1024 Senate reports, 586 House documents, and 1643 House reports, making a total of 3598. The total number of publications indexed is slightly smaller than the total number for the long session of the Fifty-fourth Congress, but the addition of the numerical list not contained in the Index for that session makes the present volume the largest "consolidated index" that has been issued since the establishment of this office in January, 1895. The Senate documents will be bound in 30 volumes, the Senate reports in 8, the House documents in 88, and the House reports in 7, making a total of 133 volumes of the Congressional reserve for the session, exclusive of the Senate and House Journals.

Changes, not suggested by the Office of the Superintendent of Documents, have been made in the title-pages of the annual reports of the Executive Departments for the second session of the Fifty-fifth Congress. The words "Being part of the message and documents communicated to the two Houses of Congress, etc.," have been omitted from the title-pages, which now read for the annual reports of the War, Navy, Post-Office, Interior, and Agriculture Departments, "Annual reports of the ——— Department for the fiscal year 1897," followed by subtitles to indicate the subject-matter of the several volumes. Heretofore the report of the War Department has been distinguished by volume numbers, v. 1 containing the report of the Secretary of War and miscellaneous reports, v. 2 the report of the Chief of Engineers in several parts, and v. 3 the report of the Chief of Ordnance. The volume numbers have now been dispensed with, but in making out the schedule for the series of House documents of the second session the usual order of arrangement has been maintained. The volume numbers for the report of the Interior Department have likewise been omitted, but the usual order, namely, Secretary and General Land Office, Indian affairs, miscellaneous, Geo-

logical Survey, and Education Bureau, has been preserved by means of the volume numbers of the House document series. Unfortunately, however, there will not be this guide to assist persons in arranging the same volumes, when bound in cloth without the Congressional document series number.

The fact should be noted that the title-page of the bureau edition of the report of the General Land Office, which heretofore read, "Annual report of the Commissioner of the General Land Office," reads, for the year 1897, "Annual reports of the Department of the Interior," with the subtitle, "Report of the Commissioner of the General Land Office." This bureau edition for the 1897 report has 479 pages; the Departmental and Congressional editions of the same report have cxlvii + 484 pages, the title-page reading the same, except that the words "Report of the Secretary of the Interior," indicating the subject-matter of the additional pages, are prefixed to the subtitle. This Congressional edition only is included in this Index.

A similar state of affairs exists in the case of the report of the Indian Bureau, where the bureau and Departmental editions in cloth have identical title-pages, the bureau edition having viii + 604 pages and the Departmental viii + 1068 pages, and there is nothing on the title-page to indicate that there is more included in one volume than in the other, as there is in the case of the General Land Office. The additional pages contain the proposals for Indian supplies and the report and proceedings at Lake Mohonk of the Board of Indian Commissioners. The Congressional edition, containing exactly the same matter as the Departmental edition, is the only one included in this Index.

Owing to the fact that the Document Index is issued in advance of some of the publications listed therein, considerable opportunity is afforded for inaccuracies arising from this cause. Constant effort is made to have each index as complete as possible, yet after seeking information from all available sources it was impossible to foresee that part 2 of Comparison of Tariffs of 1897, 1894, and 1890, instead of being numbered as part 2 of Senate document 192 of the first session of the Fifty-fifth Congress, should be numbered as Senate document 329 of the second session; and the title-page bears nothing to identify the latter as part 2 of the former. Part 2 will be bound with part 1 in Senate documents, vol. 11, Fifty-fifth Congress, first session.

At the time when the Document Index of the Fifty-fifth Congress, first session, was issued, only part 1 of the report of the Joint Select Committee to Investigate Charities and Reformatory Institutions in the District of Columbia had appeared, but it was known that the report was to be in three parts. But, instead of being issued as three parts of Senate document 185, Fifty-fifth Congress, first session, part 2 was issued in two forms as Senate report 700 and House report 776 of the second session; and part 3 was issued as Senate report 781 and

House report 1092 of the second session. So that part 1 appeared only as a Senate document of the first session, while parts 2 and 3 appeared both as Senate and House reports of the second session. As a natural solution of this problem it has been decided that parts 2 and 3, Senate reports 700 and 781, second session, shall be bound with part 1 as volume 8 of Senate documents of the first session. Parts 2 and 3, House reports 776 and 1092, will be included in the last volume of the House reports of the second session.

When Senate report 81, Fifty-fifth Congress, first session, relative to Sioux City and Pacific Railway bonds, was issued, there was no reason to suppose that the report was incomplete; but on March 23, 1898, during the period of the second session, the views of the minority were ordered printed and bear the number Senate report 81, part 2, second session. For the reason that the numbers of the two parts are identical, though the sessions differ, they will be bound together in volume 1 of Senate reports of the first session.

These facts are mentioned in order to explain why a few statements made in the Document Index of the Fifty-fifth Congress, first session, have, for causes which could not be foreseen, proved either incomplete or incorrect.
